Summary of Main Activities

The Capital Review Committee was created in 2014 as part of the introduction of improved Shared Governance arrangements for the review of capital projects. The Committee met four times between November 2014 and April 2015 to review projects that were brought to the committee by Heiddi Davis, Director of Planning, Design and Construction and the chair of the committee, MU Operations Vice Chancellor, Gary Ward.

Projects Reviewed and Recommended to Chancellor Loftin:

- Lafferre Hall – Renovations and Repairs
- Dobbs Group Replacement – Phase I
- Missouri Orthopaedic Institute – Four Story Addition
- Hill Hall Addition (College of Education): For inclusion on the 2015 Master Plan.
- Lafferre Hall Architectural Changes to Campus: PDC Director, Heiddi Davis, Project Manager, Jude Wawrzyniak and the Architectural Consultant, Brad Wright, with PWA, presented the architectural changes to the committee.
- New Softball Stadium

Projects Reviewed:

- Stewart Hall - Renovation and Repairs: When this project was presented to the committee in November 2014, Stewart Hall was to be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education for approval. This project will come back to the committee for review.
- College of Vet Med Ambulatory Teaching Facility: The Capital Review Committee was briefed on this project. The final exterior images will be provided for approval during the design process.
- Summer Projects on the Francis Quadrangle: Project scheduled for May 18 - June 30, 2015 and will include pavers around the columns and inlets on each side of the monument.
